### The Magician's Nephew

Even though "The Magician's Nephew" was the sixth book published by C.S. Lewis, it was actually meant as the prequel of the infamous The Chronicles of Narnia series. It is the story of young Digory and his friend Polly who, with the help of three magical rings, set out on a series of adventures through mythical kingdoms and enchanted lands.

Previously in 2006, "The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe" was staged at the old On Broadway Theater location. We are happy to continue the trend of staging Children's Theater with the inclusion of this play, adapted by the very talented playwright, Aurand Harris.

Directed by veteran actor/director Joe Vos, it stars Coos Bay/North Bend students Graci Berndt (Extra Animal), Alyshia Fox (Bear), Laura Kuehn (Rabbit), Ashlee Pemberton (Bear), Ruth Pierce (Queen Jadis), Mikayla Slaska (Bird), McKenna Spencer (Polly) and Brandon Vos (Digory). The adult roles include Larry Pierce (Uncle Andrew), Jeri Thurkow (Aunt) & Joe Vos (Aslan).

THE MAGICIAN'S NEPHEW opens



March 28th and is slated to run through April 13th, with Friday and Saturday performances at 7:00 PM and Sunday matinees at 2:00 PM.

There will be a Gussies menu available for those wishing to order food and refreshments separately. A sampling of entrees from the last Dinner Theatre included mouthwatering Flat Iron Steak, Coconut Prawns, Fettucinni Alfredo and Veal Scaloppini. The children's menu included chicken strips, burgers, and grilled-cheese sandwiches. Plan on arriving early for those of you wishing to take in dinner (on Friday & Saturday eves) or lunch (on Sunday afternoons). Dinner orders will be taken at 6 pm prior to 7 pm show times, and Lunch orders at 1 pm for the 2 pm matinees.

Ticket prices for the Show only are \$10.00 adults for Friday and Saturday evening performances, and \$8.00 for Sunday matinees, with children age 12 and under for \$7.00. Meals are priced separately.

### note from the editor...

The son of a country doctor and a drama teacher, Aurand Harris (1915-1996) is one of this country's most beloved and produced playwrights of children's theater, writing a tremendous body of contrasting plays for young audiences. He delighted in exploring new and different styles, including vaudevillian (The Tobey Show), melodramas (Rags to Riches), as well as what he coined his "death shows," (The Arkansas Bear) - plays telling the story of young people coping with loss. He always knew how to tell with the perfect balance of humor & sensitivity, with enough emotion for adults to cry at, and children to learn from. Sometimes he adapted traditional stories such as Pocahontas, or The Prince and the Pauper for the stage; other times he tended to gravitate towards other well knowns such as The Magician's Nephew. Like all great playwrights, Aurand had a wonderful imagination and if the mood so struck him, was fully capable of penning his own original works such as is the case with the affable Monkey Magic, Pinballs, or his final play, The Orphan Train. For more than four decades he wrote more than 50 plays, many of which have went on to become classics in their own right in the world of children's repertory. His publisher, Anchorage Press, estimates by the early 1990's, his plays had been performed more than 30,000 times!

The Charlotte Chorpening Award is one given to playwright's who've written a body of plays that lift the field of children's theatre. Aurand was the only playwright to win this twice over. In 1980, Aurand went to China on the

heels of Arthur Miller's Death of a Salesman production. At the request of the Shanghai Children's Art Theatre (the oldest children's theatre in China), and funding support from The Children's Theatre Foundation of America, Aurand directed the first ever production of an American children's play there. The play, Rags to Riches, was translated into Chinese and performed by Chinese actors. Aurand quickly became not only a bringer of joy to American children, but now, to children around the world. Children's Theatre lost a great friend, playwright, and human being in the Spring of 1996, when Aurand Harris passed away at the age of 81. However, his creative genius continues to live on in the form of staged productions of his work. OBT is proud to stage one of Aurand's favorite adaptations, The Magician's Nephew, and hopes you will help support OBT children's theatre with your attendance. See you in the aisles,

(There's a printable map on the OBT website, with directions to both the Egyptian and to Gussies — www.onbroadwaytheater.com — just click the button that says VIRTUAL MAP located at the top of our webpage. If you know where the Harless Y Marina is, you're practically there! Gussies is about half a block further heading towards the Bay. You can't miss it. Big sign on the right hand side that says GUSSIES. 7-11 is right across the street on your left. The main street that runs between these businesses is Newmark, the cross street is Schoneman. If you end up passing McKays Market (also on the right), then you've driven a couple blocks too far past Gussies. This part of town is considered the "Empire area" which consolidated with Coos Bay awhile back.. Anyways, I promise, it's easy to locate. ### **NEA** Funding

According to the AMERICAN ARTS ALLIANCE, last June the House of Representatives approved a \$35 million increase for the NEA funding for a 2008 Fiscal Year appropriation of \$160 million. # COLUMBUS STATE UNIVERSITY International Playwriting Competition 2008 Larry Corse Prize for Playwriting

The Larry Corse Prize for Playwriting was established in 2003 by Larry Corse, Professor Emeritus of Theatre and English at Clayton State University, to encourage the development and production of new works for the stage. The prize has been awarded four times and in each of these years the competition received more than 300 plays from around the world. For a list of previous winners, go to **www.larrycorse.com** 

**The Prize:** \$1,000 and a production by Columbus State University Department of Theatre in the 2009-2010 school year. **Eligibility:** The competition is open to all.

### The Play:

- 1 A play submitted to the competition should be finished, original, in English and must not have been previously published or performed (excluding workshop readings).
- 2 The play should be full-length and should a running time between 60 and 120 minutes.
- 3 The number of actors needed for the play should be between 5 and 10.

COLUMBUS STATE UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT OF THEATRE will have first production rights for the winning play. The playwright will retain all other rights, including copyright, publication, and performance rights. If for some reason, Columbus State University Department of Theatre is not able to produce the winning play within two years of the announcement of the winner, first production rights revert to the playwright. If, in the opinion of the jury, no play worthy of the prize is submitted, Columbus State University Department of Theatre reserves the right to withhold the prize.

### Submitting a Play:

- 1. Because the play will be sent to the juries anonymously, the author's name should not appear on any page of the play.
- 2. Plays should be submitted with a cover sheet containing the following information:
  - a. Author's name
  - b. Author's address
  - c. Title of play
  - d. Author's phone number and e-mail address
  - e. A signed statement that the play has not been previously produced or published.
- 3. A synopsis of the play must also be included. The synopsis should cover the plot succinctly and not be a teaser or advertising copy.
- 4. Plays previously submitted to the competition may not be re-submitted unless major revision has taken place.
- 5. Deadline for Submission: Plays must be received by the Columbus International Playwriting Competition on or before April 1, 2008.

The copies of the plays submitted will not be returned. Please do not send one and only originals.

The plays will initially be read by theater professionals. Semi-finalists will then be submitted to the Theatre Faculty of Columbus State University for final judging. The selection process should be complete by September, 2008.

The winning playwright may be invited to Columbus State University for workshops and lectures for a few days prior to the opening night of the production.



### GENERAL AUDITION INFO:

Auditions are generally held 2 months prior to a Play's opening (3 months for musicals).

You will be asked to fill out an official Audition Form listing contact info, special skills, experience, and other pertinent info. Dress comfortably but appropriately, be punctual, and come prepared to read, dance, or sing (depending on the script). Generally seek enthusiastic people who look and feel comfortable on stage, listen well and follow directions easily, and are open-minded enough to try new & different roles than originally intended auditioning for. If you sing or can play an instrument, let your talent be known! We're always looking for House musicians & singers for our musicals!

Always a need for Light & Sound Techs, Stage Managers, Stagehands, Choreographers, Vocal Coaches, Costumers, Makeup Artists, Poster & Programs designers, Set Construction, Graphic Artists, Directors & Assistants, Producers. If you have free time or would like to break into theatre in this way, please call 269-2501 or email or come to one of our open auditions and talk with a Director.
